



Notice of Upcoming Work at Twickenham Station

29th April 2019

Following our previous communication regarding the works at Twickenham Station, we are writing to update you that we will be carrying out the following overnight and Sunday day work activities during May, these are a continuation of works from last weekends possession;

- Continuing the Installation of the remaining cladding to the podium stairs, lift shaft and main balcony, using hand tools with access at height using mobile elevated work platforms during overnight periods.
- Continuing the Installation of the new platform canopy steelwork and roof cladding, using hand tools and a mini-crane during overnight periods.
- Continuing the Internal fit out works inside the new station building, comprising of installation of services and builders works during Sunday (daytime hours)

These overnight and Sunday daytime works will take place over the following periods at the locations shown in yellow below.

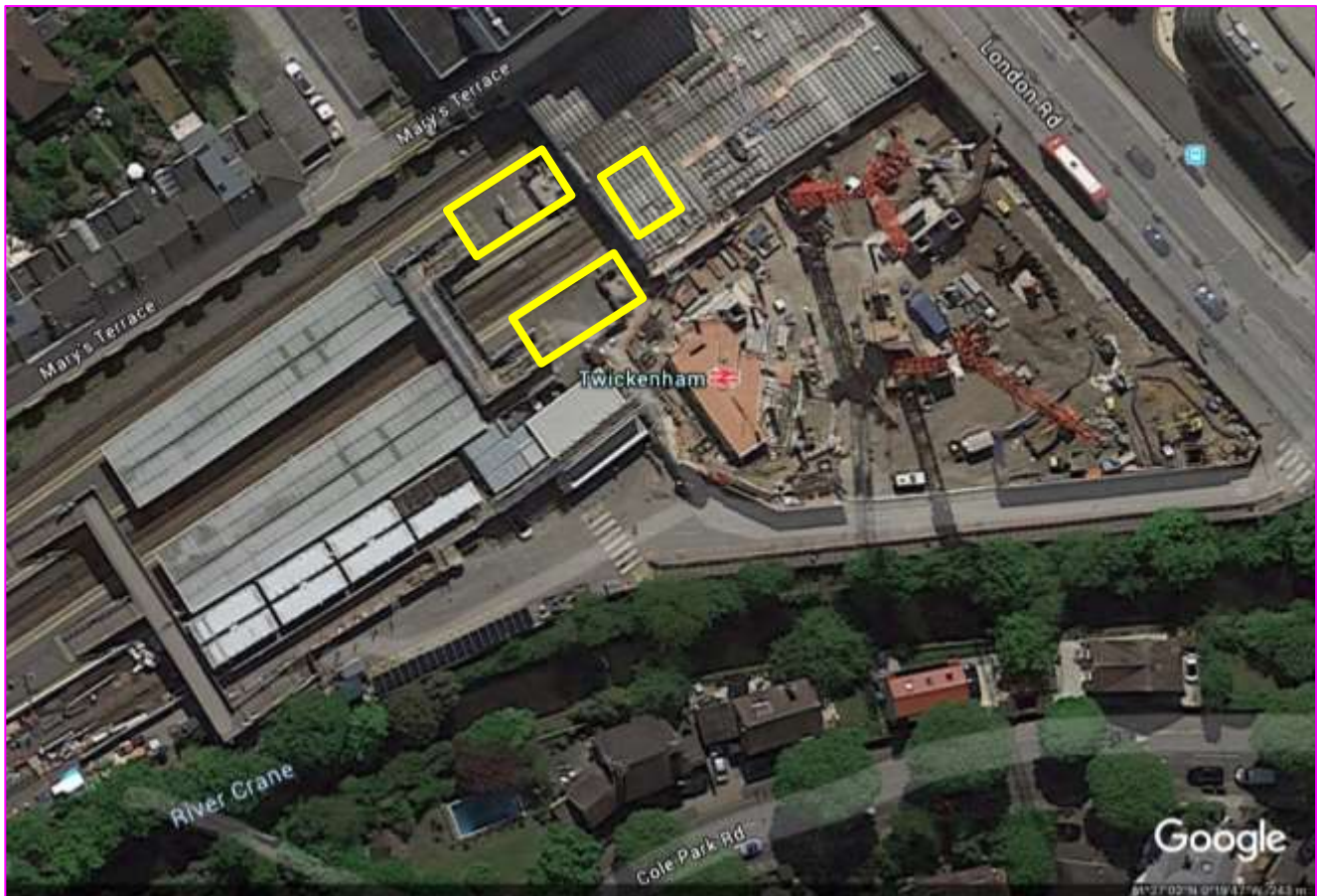

During this time, we will work without disrupting train and station operations and will use a line block to safely access the space in between platforms and lift in plant and materials over the railway lines using the tower crane. Preparation work will start from 10pm every evening and once the last train has departed the line block will commence at 1am and enable us to work until 5am, before clearing the site and completing work by 6am. The Sunday works will start at 9am until 5pm.

This work will involve the use of plant and equipment likely to create some noise disturbance. Fencing with a layer of echo barriers will be used to reduce the disturbance where practicable, and noise monitoring will be in place to manage the works.
