

Reminder of Upcoming Work at Twickenham Station

We are writing to update you on our works in June

Works Update:

Please find attached the notification which was delivered in April 2019.

There is a small change to the notification which we would like to update you on.

Times for scheduled works on Mary's Terrace.

- The end time of the road closure will be brought forward from 17:00 to 15:30.

The team are looking to complete these works on Mary's Terrace as soon as we can. The team has been briefed on appropriate noise mitigation measures and will be mindful of neighbors as these works take place.

These works will occur in advance of Mary's Terrace parking being reinstated, which is now programmed for December 2019. This change has occurred because of delays to the completion of façade works to Block B. We will provide more detailed information about these changes closer to the time. Residents can continue to use Station Yard car park whilst parking is suspended.

We apologise in advance for this disruption and we advise you to factor in the elevated noise levels within your plans during these periods. Please note, the station will be closed on 30th June to enable these works to take place. For help planning a journey, please visit www.nationalrail.co.uk.
